Accelerated - Accelerated learning incorporates hands-on experiences with positive reinforcement of the natural learning abilities of every individual.
 Class - Traditional classroom with instructor present for lecture or laboratory activities.
 Clinical - Clinical experience under an instructor in a real health care setting such as a hospital, nursing home, or medical office.
 Field - Observational experience outside the classroom.
 Flex Lab in Class - A blend of face-to-face instruction and flexible lab.
 Flex Lab Online - Students complete coursework in a virtual classroom over the Internet. Students complete lab activities online, or in the skills lab on a flexible schedule during any of the published open lab hours.

Hybrid - Hybrid courses are a blend of face-to-face and online instruction. In a hybrid course, a portion of the learning is online and the amount of classroom seat-time is reduced.
 Hybrid ITV - Hybrid/ITV courses are a blend of face-to-face and online instruction. The face-to-face instruction is conducted through live video and audio links (see ITV) to connect students at remote sites with instructors.
 IA - Individually arranged courses allow students to complete the majority of coursework using independent study. Students are expected to meet with the instructor on a regular basis.
 ITV - Interactive television courses connect students in different locations with instructors through live video and audio links. Students can see and hear each other, and the instructor, at all sites.
 Online - Students complete coursework in a virtual classroom over the Internet. Students interact with the instructor and other students, complete assignments, and take exams via Nicolet's online learning system.
